

Pee Wee Reese: (11 & 12 year olds as of April 30, 2012--5th/6th Grade)

Cost: \$85.00 per player. Players that make the AAA will pay \$52 in addition to the registration fee to offset uniform costs and league fees. These players cannot participate until the fee is paid.

Uniform: All players will receive a Big Lake Team Hat, shirt, pants, belt and socks.

Season Length: April 1 through July (Games may start the first week of May for AAA)

Nights of the Week: Varies (practices dates and times are up to each Team)

Game Time: In-House--6:30pm to 8:30pm; AAA varies (normally 6:30pm)

Number of Games: 14-18 games and playoffs (and possibly additional games at the Big Lake Tournament May 11-13). These tournament games for Big Lake teams are free, and aren't included in the registration fee. Tournament games could be played May 11.

Locations: Big Lake School Fields and out-of-town at teams in the league

AAA League Includes: Area teams in the Gopher State Baseball League

In-House League Includes: Big Lake, Becker, Monticello, Clear Lake

In-House End of the Year Tournament: July 20-22 in Big Lake

COACHING INFORMATION

Coach's Clinics: To be considered a coach, you must attend a coach's clinic during Evaluations (RC coaches may have a clinic at a different time).

How Coaches and Teams are picked for the "AAA" Teams: All players must be registered and paid before the initial evaluation. If a player cannot attend an evaluation, they cannot make up their evaluation at another time. The 15 players with the highest scores will be eligible for the second tryout. A parent that is interested in being the Head Coach of the team must have their child finish in the top 8 after both evaluations and attend the Coaching Clinics. The eligible coaching staff will be notified (a coach whose child finishes in the top 12 can attend the 2nd evaluation, but cannot help or talk to any of the players). Once the coaching staff of the top 12 players is identified, a second evaluation of the top 15 players and up to 9 other invited players (decided upon and completed by the Evaluation Coordinators) will be held. Only the coaches that signed up to be Head coaches will be allowed to watch the second evaluations. The team must be picked from the top 18 kids after the 2nd Evaluation. If a child is not able to make one of the evaluations, then their one score would be multiplied by 2 to see where their score would land in relation to the other scores. If the child's score is not in the window of the scores of the top 18, then the child is not eligible for the AAA team. If the multiplied score reaches the Top 8, the child would need to be a coach's pick. The children who finished in the Top 8 are automatically invited to the AAA team. The head coach has the choice of the other 4 players, adhering to the guidelines above.

How Coaches and Teams are picked for the "In-House" Teams: All the players that do not make or do not want to be on the "AAA" Team will play on a combined age "In-House" team. Once the head coaches are identified, the list of players to be drafted will be placed in groups as to how they finished in alphabetical order. For example, if there are 5 teams, the players who finished 1-10 will be placed in a group alphabetically. If there are 3 teams, players who finished 1-6 will be placed in a group alphabetically. The order of the coach's draft will be determined by a coin flip, card drawing, dice toss, or other method approved upon by the Draft Coordinator. After the order is determined, the coaches will first draft players in the first group. For example, if there are 3 teams, team number 1 will pick a player in the top 6. Team number 2 will pick a player remaining in the top 6. Team 3 will get the next TWO picks of the players remaining in the top 6. The next round will continue the same way. If the HEAD coach's child is in a certain round, the coach MUST pick their child as their first pick in that round. If a Head Coach has a certain assistant coach in mind, the assistant coach's child must be chosen with the Head Coach's first available pick of the applicable round. There is no guarantee that the Head Coach and the assistant coach will be paired up; it is up to the luck of the draw and of the draft. A BLBA Board Member will be present at the Draft.

Coaching assignments for the Roberto Clemente will be completed on April 29 at Field #7. This will start at 6:00pm. Coaches for all teams will then contact their players.

If all eligible Head coaches are not able to work out the assignments of a particular team, the matter will be decided upon by the BLBA board, using a method decided upon by the Board of Directors. If a parent cannot be found for a head coaching position, a suitable replacement will be found. A person may only sign up to be a head coach for ONE team. This must be declared at the Mass Registration. The BLBA board may decide to assign a non-parent coach to a team at the BLBA board's discretion.

Uniforms: once uniforms are distributed to the head coaches, there will be a ONE-WEEK window for parents/coaches to make adjustments and/or changes. It will be up to the Head Coach and/or parent to contact the Uniform Coordinator, Dale Miller (763-639-4646)

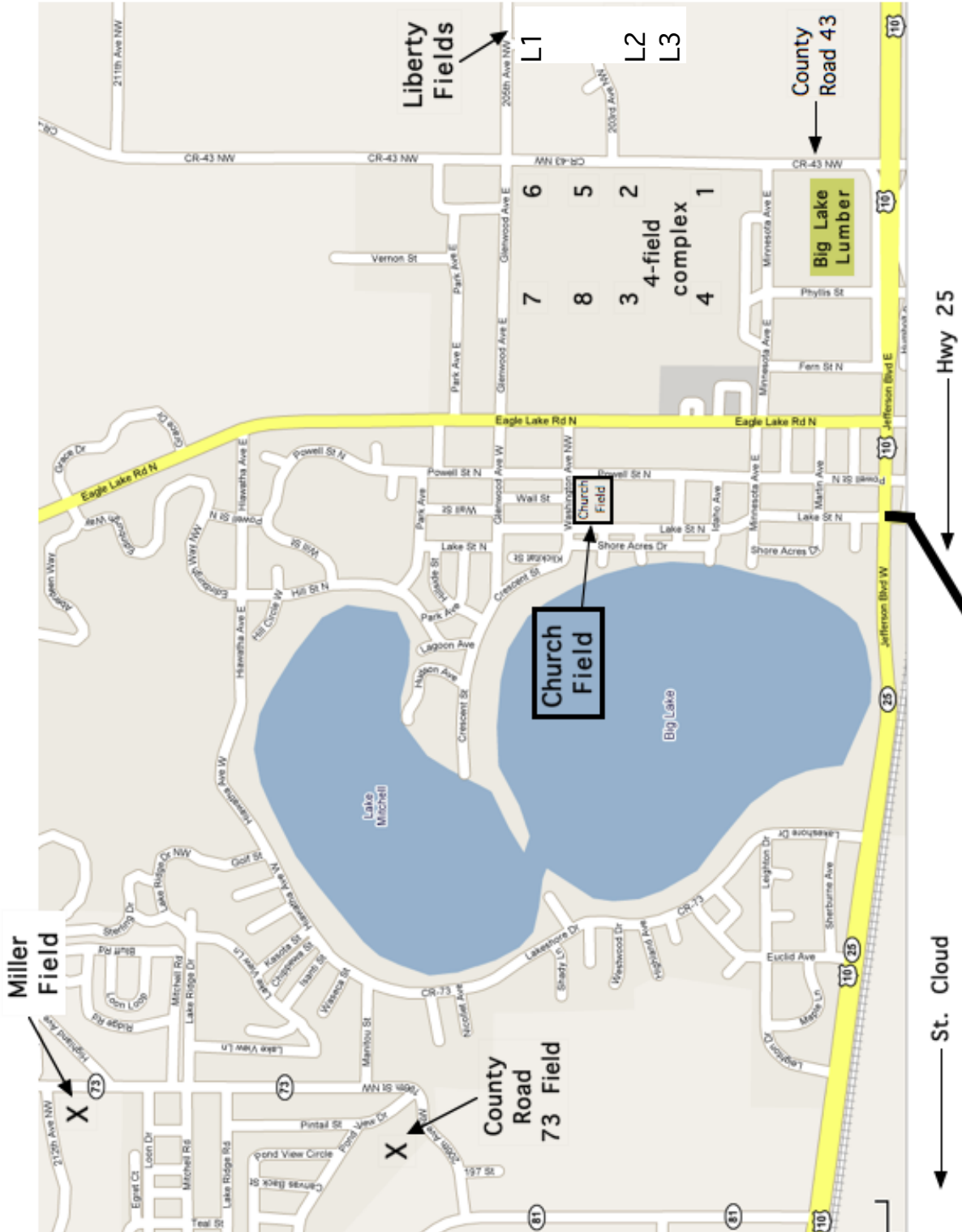
- 1) In the improvement and development of baseball skills.

Volunteer Fee

There will be a mandatory \$100 volunteer fee required at registration. Please make a check out for \$100 payable to BLBA, separate from the registration check, with your child's name(s) written on the check. You will be required to volunteer for 4 hours throughout the season. Registrations mailed in will not be valid unless accompanied by your volunteer fee. Your volunteer check will be shredded at the end of the season (we will not return the check to you) if you volunteer a minimum of 4 hours. Volunteer fees will be forfeited if you do not perform volunteer work during the season. If you do not intend to volunteer and wish to waive your volunteer fee at the time of registration please write "CASH MY CHECK" on the memo line on your check. This will allow us to hire any additional help that may be needed. It is up to the head coach to pick his assistant and parent rep. **It is also up to the coach to report these names no later than ONE WEEK after teams are chosen to the website.** If no names are submitted by the end of that week, no volunteer hours will be allotted. Once names are submitted by the coach, **NO CHANGES** may occur. Extra team help is appreciated and needed, however your time helping at practices and games will not count for volunteer time. The volunteer coordinator and/or any BLBA Board Members are the only people that can approve your volunteer time. If you have questions regarding your time or efforts of volunteering you may email the Volunteer Coordinator (food@biglakebaseball.com). Please don't be mistaken and assume your time is approved if you have not spoken with the Volunteer Coordinator about your time and efforts. You must have approval before you complete a volunteer opportunity. For weather related issues--you MAY get rescheduled to work another shift.

Volunteer opportunities are available at www.biglakebaseball.com, by clicking on Volunteer. All volunteer positions, including coaches and assistant coaches are required to pay the volunteer fee and will have his/her check shredded up upon successful completion of the position. Board positions are eligible to have their check shredded as well. The \$100 volunteer fee will be collected by each team's parent rep. After the money is collected, then each team will receive their uniforms.

If you neglect to show up for an assigned shift, your check will be cashed immediately. No other options will be available.

*Tournament times are filled first--then weekend shifts will be filled.
